Event Summary:

Scott White Contemporary Art presents *INTERVALS*, an exhibition featuring paintings by Gene Davis, Kenneth Noland and Tim Bavington opening Friday, March 12, 2010, on view through Saturday, May 8, 2010.

The opening reception will take place in the gallery on Friday, March 12, 2010, from 6:00 – 8:00 p.m. The reception is free and open to the public. Light refreshments will be served.

Exhibition Details:

INTERVALS explores the colorful work of Gene Davis, Kenneth Noland and Tim Bavington, all whom depict bands of stripes that study color, rhythm and pattern. A number of the paintings refer to musical compositions, studying beats, melodies and moods conveyed by compositions by musicians that each artist took influence from. While Gene Davis and Kenneth Noland were prolific painters of the 1960's, the contemporary artist Tim Bavington carries forward the tradition brought upon by the work of Noland and Davis.

Artist Information:

Kenneth Noland and Gene Davis established the Washington Color School in Washington D.C. in the late 1950's through the 1960's. Part of the larger color field

movement, the artists of the Washington Color School were identified in an exhibition entitled "Washington Color Painters", shown at the Washington Gallery of Modern Art in 1965. Known for minimal, orderly and colorful paintings using stripes, washes and single fields of colors, the group contributed much to the study of color theories established during this era.

Las Vegas based painter Tim Bavington airbrushes bands of acrylic paint onto large-scale canvases. Influenced largely by rock music, Bavington uses his computer to develop linear schemes out of rhythms and beats from his favorite tunes. Bavington received his BFA from the Art Centre in Pasadena, CA before making the permanent move to Las Vegas, where he completed his MFA at the University of Nevada, NV.
